



CREATIVE STATEMENTS

A Personal Statement from Steve Wilson, Director of Roald Dahl's Matilda the Musical



At the core of our journey as theater artists is the mission to tell incredible stories. We want these to be exciting and entertaining, but also enlightening and thought provoking. We hope to transport you to another world where the rules might be a little different, but the universal truths are recognizable.

As an educator at heart, I am always thrilled when the tale we tell can be equally appreciated by children and adults, alike. Few stories accomplish this as successfully as Roald Dahl's 1988 children's masterpiece *Matilda* - a character driven narrative that keeps readers on the edge of their seats with quirky twists and unexpected turns while fantastical personalities


amuse and delight. When enhanced by the music and lyrics of Tim Minchin and a book by Dennis Kelly, Roald Dahl's *Matilda the Musical* packs some powerful storytelling magic.

This musical-parable offers a bold depiction of opposites – light and dark; good and evil; quiet and loud; brilliant and ignorant. It connects a child-centered narrative to the larger, grittier, and more mature world that adults will recognize immediately. It enchants us with a plausible form of magic as Matilda's powers are based on telekinesis instead of a more traditional exploration of magic, as with Harry Potter, for example. The themes are deep and complex. They span the gamut from the value of learning to the importance of taking action and standing up for yourself. The story's bleaker moments energize its life-affirming final message -- "good will prevail over evil."

The team assembled to realize Town Hall Arts Center's production is, in a word, exceptional. A gifted array of designers and technicians as well as my beloved artistic partners — dynamic musical director Donna Debreceni and incomparable choreographer/assistant director/master educator Carrie Colton. And of course, our talented cast of younger and older actors who have coalesced into a close-knit ensemble. We truly believe in the power of young artists. We believe in their talent, energy, and ability to inspire us with their unbounded creativity, curiosity, and joy.

We hope our production will enhance your holiday celebrations as you consider the brave words of our motivational little genius who believes that... "Just because you find that life's not fair, it doesn't mean that you just have to grin and bear it! If you always take it on the chin and wear it, you might as well be saying you think that it's okay - and that's not right! And if it's not right, you have to put it right!"
