

A Personal Statement from Director & Choreographer, Christopher Page-Sanders



Dear Patron of the Arts.

We are celebrating 65 years of Lorraine Hansberry's American Classic A Raisin in the Sun, which opened on Broadway in 1960, and 50 years of Raisin, the Broadway musical adaptation that took the world by storm during the 1973-1974 Broadway season. Both A Raisin in the Sun and Raisin have won numerous awards and accolades, including Tony Awards for Best Play in 1960 and Best Musical in 1974. In 2004, I was privileged to perform in the St. Louis regional premiere of Raisin with the St. Louis Black Repertory Company. That experience with this material was a life-defining moment, and it catapulted me into

becoming the artist I am today. Over the years, both the play and the musical have served as a springboard to help launch and guide the careers of many artists: Lorraine Hansberry, Sidney Portier, Ruby Dee, Claudia McNeil, Ralph Carter, Debbie Allen, Virginia Capers, Joe Morton, Helen Martin, Donald McKayle and MORE! You cannot deny the effect that A Raisin in the Sun has had on us; many of us remember reading it in English class, watching one of the film adaptations, or witnessing it, live, in the theater. If this is your first time seeing this American Story or your one-hundredth time, I welcome you. As the world is dealing with so much grief and we are trying to find safe places to mourn and healthy ways to cope, may I offer this story and this time in the theater as a safe space for you to mourn, to grieve, and to find hope. We call out the names of those who have become ancestors and say 'thank you.' I also ask everyone to remember their dreams. Remember all that has been bought and paid for in order for you to become who you are. Remember who you are!


